- 2. The Statement, which is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Company's Board of Directors, has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34, Interim Financial Reporting ('Ind AS 34'), prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act'), and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and is in compliance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended), including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.

We conducted our review of the Statement in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagements (SRE) 2410, Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI"). Notes to the standalone financial results:

- 1 The above standalone financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on 5 August 2021.
- 2 The above financial results have been prepared in accordance with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- 3 The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year ended 31 March 2021 and the unaudited published year to date figures upto 31 December 2020 which were subjected to limited review.
- 4 Management has made an assessment of the impact of COVID 19, in preparation of these financial statements. Management has considered all relevant external and internal factors in the measurement of assets and liabilities including recoverability of carrying values of assets of the Company, its liquidity position and ability to repay debts. No adjustment to key estimates and judgements that impact the financial results are required. However, the impact assessment of COVID19 will be a continuing process given the uncertainties associated with it, however no significant impact is envisaged on the operations, as of now bearing unforeseen circumstances.
- 5 During the Previous year, the Company was made aware of certain liquidated damages and project cost overrun with respect to the delay in the execution of an overseas Engineering Procurement and Constructions (EPC) project. The management believes that the impact of this should be restated in the respective lines on the financial statements/ information of the previous periods. The restatement was on account of omissions of the past, which had been taken into consideration in the relevant accounting periods to which they relate to. Accordingly, the impact on Earnings Per Share (EPS) had been considered.

Pursuant to the impact of aforesaid changes, the Company had restated the financial statements/ results for the comparative periods, in accordance with the requirements of Ind-AS 8-'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'. The Retained Earnings (other equity) as at 1 April 2019, within the Statement of Changes in Equity, have also been restated to adjust the impact of such adjustments which relate to the prior periods. The impact of aforesaid restatements for the quarter ended 30 June 2020 is as follows:

- During the Previous year, the Company had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the sale/transfer of its right in Ahmednagar property admeasuring 66,108 square meters, as is where basis, for a consideration of Rs. 1,462 lakhs which has been duly approved by Board. Till 30 June 2021, the Company has received Rs. 723 lakhs as advance against the transactions. The transactions is likely to be completed by December 2021, hence the same has been shown as 'Assets classified as held for sale'.
- Exceptional items for the year ended 31 March 2021, includes Rs. 140 lakhs provision for diminution in the value of investment in its 100% subsidiary "Ador Welding Academy Private Limited", Rs. 848 lakhs (including Rs. 819 lakhs provision and Rs. 29 lakhs written off towards various factors like movement in collection of C forms, Assessment order received during the year etc.) and provisions amounting to Rs. 1,549 lakhs which includes Rs. 1,305 lakhs receivables from a project executed in the Kuwait, for which appropriate actions has been taken by the Company and the matter is pending in the Court of Law of Kuwait.

- The above consolidated financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on 5 August 2021.
- 2. The above financial results have been prepared in accordance with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- 3 The consolidated financial results of the Group have been prepared as per Ind AS 110 Consolidated Financial Statements.
- 4 The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year ended 31 March 2021 and the unaudited published year to date figures upto 31 December 2020 which were subjected to limited review.
- Management has made an assessment of the impact of COVID 19, in preparation of these financial statements. Management has considered all relevant external and internal factors in the measurement of assets and liabilities including recoverability of carrying values of assets of the Group, its liquidity position and ability to repay debts. No adjustment to key estimates and judgements that impact the financial results are required. However, the impact assessment of COVID19 will be a continuing process given the uncertainties associated with it, however no significant impact is envisaged on the operations, as of now bearing unforescen circumstances.
- 6 During the Previous year, the Group was made aware of certain liquidated damages and project cost overrun with respect to the delay in the execution of an overseas Engineering Procurement and Constructions (EPC) project. The management believes that the impact of this should be restated in the respective lines on the financial statements/ information of the previous periods. The restatement was on account of omissions of the past, which had been taken into consideration in the relevant accounting periods to which they relate to. Accordingly, the impact on Earnings Per Share (EPS) had been considered.

Pursuant to the impact of aforesaid changes, the Group had restated the financial statements/ results for the comparative periods, in accordance with the requirements of Ind-AS 8 - 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'. The Retained Earnings (other equity) as at 1 April 2019, within the Statement of Changes in Equity, have also been restated to adjust the impact of such adjustments which relate to the prior periods. The impact of aforesaid restatements for the quarter ended 30 June 2020 is as follows:

- During the Previous year, the Holding Company had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the sale/transfer of its right in Ahmednagar property admeasuring 66,108 square meters, as is where basis, for a consideration of Rs. 1,462 lakhs which has been duly approved by Board. Till 30 June 2021, the Holding Company has received Rs. 723 lakhs as advance against the transactions. The transactions is likely to be completed by December 2021, hence the same has been shown as 'Assets classified as held for sale'.
- 8 Exceptional items for the year ended 31 March 2021, Rs. 848 lakhs (including Rs. 819 lakhs provision and Rs. 29 lakhs written off towards various factors like movement in collection of C forms, Assessment order received during the year etc.) and provisions amounting to Rs. 1,549 lakhs which includes Rs. 1,305 lakhs receivables from a project executed in the Kuwait, for which appropriate actions has been taken by the Company and the matter is pending in the Court of Law of Kuwait.
