POLICY FOR DISCLOSURE OF MATERIAL EVENTS

***[Pursuant to Regulation 30(4)(ii) of Securities Exchange Board of India
(Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015]***

1. PREFACE

This Policy for Disclosure of Material Events will be known as "ADOR WELDING LIMITED Disclosure Policy", hereinafter referred to as 'Policy'.

The policy is formulated in accordance with the Regulation 30 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("LODR Regulations"). The Board of Directors ("Board") has adopted this Policy and procedures thereto with regard to Materiality of Events / Information to be disclosed to Stock Exchange(s), where the securities are listed.

2. OBJECTIVE OF THE POLICY

To ensure adequate disclosure of an event or price sensitive information ("Material Event / Information") fully, fairly, correctly, timely and transparently to the Stock Exchange(s), as per the prescribed regulations, so that present and potential investors are able to take informed decision/s, with respect to their investment in the Company.

For this purpose, material event / information means any information, which relates to the Company and which, if published, is likely to materially affect the price of shares of the Company, and includes all events or information with respect to subsidiaries, which are material for the Company, if any.

3. CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING MATERIALITY

EVENTS WHICH ARE DEEMED TO BE MATERIAL EVENTS:

The Company shall disclose all such events, which are specified in Para A of Part A of Schedule III of LODR Regulations, without any application of the guidelines for materiality as specified in Regulation 30 of LODR Regulations. (Refer Annexure A)

EVENTS WHICH ARE DEPENDENT ON APPLICATION OF GUIDELINES FOR MATERIALITY:

The Company shall disclose all such material events pertaining to itself or its subsidiary(ies), specified in Para B of Part A (Refer Annexure B) of Schedule III of LODR Regulations, subject to application of guidelines for materiality. The Company shall consider the following criteria for

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determination of Materiality of Events / Information:

Qualitative criteria:

- i. the omission of an event or information, which is likely to result in discontinuity or alteration of event or information already available publicly; or
- ii. the omission of an event or information, which is likely to result in significant market reaction, if the said omission came to light at a later date; or
- iii. any other event / information may be treated as being material if in the opinion of the Board of Directors of Company, the event / information is considered material.

Quantitative criteria:

- iv. the omission of an event or information, whose value or expected impact in terms of value, exceeds the lower of following:
 - 2% (two percent) of turnover, as per the last audited consolidated financial statements of the listed entity;
 - 2% (two percent) of net worth, as per the last audited consolidated financial statements of the listed entity, except in case the arithmetic value of the net worth is negative;
 - 5% (five percent) of the average of absolute value of profit or loss after tax, as per the last 3 (three) audited consolidated financial statements of the listed entity. *The average of absolute value of profit or loss is to be considered by disregarding the 'sign' (positive or negative) that denotes such value as the said value / figure is required only for determining the threshold for 'materiality'.*

4. SCOPE OF DISCLOSURES

The Company shall disclose to the Stock Exchanges, where it is / its shares are listed, the following types of material events / information:

- i. Material Information / Events enlisted (as annexed) under Schedule III: Part A -Para A & B of the SEBI LODR Regulations, 2015.
- ii. In some cases, where thresholds as prescribed in clause 3(iv) of this policy, cannot be applied to ascertain materiality, the Company shall frame its opinion on a case to case basis, based on specific facts & circumstances relating to the information / event and while doing so, it may consider, the following factors, amongst others:
 - Whether there would be any direct or indirect impact on the reputation of the Company; or

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- Whether non-disclosure can lead to creation of false market sentiments, in the securities of the Company; or
- Whether there would be a significant impact on the operations or performance of the Company.

5. Time Limit for the Disclosure

The Company shall first disclose to the stock exchanges all the events or information, which are material in terms of the provisions of this regulation, as soon as reasonably possible and in any case not later than the following:

- 30 (thirty) Minutes from the closure of the meeting of the board of directors, in which the decision pertaining to the event or information has been taken;
- 12 (twelve) hours from the occurrence of the event or information, in case the event or information is emanating from within the listed entity;
- 24 (twenty-four) hours from the occurrence of the event or information, in case the event or information is not emanating from within the listed entity;

6. AUTHORISATION FOR DISCLOSURES

The Board of Directors of the Company has authorized the Executive Chairman, the Managing Director, the Chief Financial Officer & the Company Secretary (together referred to as 'KMPs'), to determine the materiality of an event or information and to make appropriate disclosure, on a timely basis.

The KMPs shall have the following powers and responsibilities for determining the material events or information:

- To review and assess an event / information that qualifies as 'material' and may require disclosure, on the basis of facts and circumstances prevailing at a given point in time.
- To determine the appropriate time, at which disclosure is to be filed / made with the stock exchanges, based on an assessment of actual time of occurrence of an event or information.
- To disclose developments that are material in nature on a regular basis, till such time the event or information is resolved / closed, with relevant explanations.
- To disclose all events or information with respect to the subsidiaries, which are material for the Company.

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- To determine the details, which in their opinion, are required to be disclosed, in the best interest of present and potential investors.

All such disclosures shall be signed by the Executive Chairman or the Managing Director or the Company Secretary or the Chief Financial Officer and in their absence by any other Director.

7. GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNICATION

In case an event or information is required to be disclosed by the Company in terms of the provisions of Regulation 30, pursuant to the receipt of a communication from any Regulatory, Statutory, Enforcement or Judicial Authority, the Company shall disclose such communication, along with the event or information, unless disclosure of such communication is prohibited by such authority.

8. REVIEW AND CHANGES TO THIS POLICY

The Compliance Officer / Board will review this Policy annually or as often as he / it considers necessary. The Board may change this Policy, as required by law, from time to time. In any circumstance where the terms of this policy differ from any existing or newly enacted law, rule, regulation or standard governing the Company, the law, rule, regulation or standard will take precedence over these policies and procedures, until such time, as this policy is changed to conform to the law, rule, regulation or standard.

9. APPROVED AND ADOPTED

This policy was approved & adopted by the Board of Directors on Wednesday, 02nd August, 2023.

The erstwhile Policy was effective from 01st December, 2015 and the amended Policy, shall be effective from 14th July, 2023.

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SCHEDULE III

PART A: DISCLOSURES OF EVENTS OR INFORMATION: SPECIFIED SECURITIES

The following shall be events/information, upon occurrence of which listed entity shall make disclosure to stock exchange(s):

A. Events which shall be disclosed without any application of the guidelines for materiality as specified in sub-regulation (4) of regulation (30):

1. ⁴⁰⁷[Acquisition(s) (including agreement to acquire), Scheme of Arrangement (amalgamation, merger, demerger or restructuring), sale or disposal of any unit(s), division(s), whole or substantially the whole of the undertaking(s) or subsidiary of the listed entity, sale of stake in associate company of the listed entity or any other restructuring.

Explanation (1) - For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, the word 'acquisition' shall mean-

- (i) acquiring control, whether directly or indirectly; or
- (ii) acquiring or agreement to acquire shares or voting rights in a company, whether existing or to be incorporated, whether directly or indirectly, such that –
 - (a) the listed entity holds shares or voting rights aggregating to five per cent or more of the shares or voting rights in the said company; or
 - (b) there has been a change in holding from the last disclosure made under sub-clause (a) of clause (ii) of the Explanation to this sub-paragraph and such change exceeds two per cent of the total shareholding or voting rights in the said company; or
 - (c) the cost of acquisition or the price at which the shares are acquired exceeds the threshold specified in sub-clause (c) of clause (i) of sub-regulation (4) of regulation 30.

Explanation (2) - For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “sale or disposal of subsidiary” and “sale of stake in associate company” shall include-

Explanation (3)- For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “undertaking” and “substantially the whole of the undertaking” shall have the same meaning as given under section 180 of the Companies Act, 2013.]

2. Issuance or forfeiture of securities, split or consolidation of shares, buyback of securities, any restriction on transferability of securities or alteration in terms or structure of existing securities including forfeiture, reissue of forfeited securities, alteration of calls, redemption of securities etc.

 4. Outcome of Meetings of the board of directors: The listed entity shall disclose to the Exchange(s), within 30 minutes of the closure of the meeting, held to consider the following:
 - a) dividends and/or cash bonuses recommended or declared or the decision to pass any dividend and the date on which dividend shall be paid/dispatched;
 - b) any cancellation of dividend with reasons thereof;
 - c) the decision on buyback of securities;
 - d) the decision with respect to fund raising proposed to be undertaken
 - e) increase in capital by issue of bonus shares through capitalization including the date on which such bonus shares shall be credited/dispatched;
 - f) reissue of forfeited shares or securities, or the issue of shares or securities held in reserve for future issue or the creation in any form or manner of new shares or securities or any other rights, privileges or benefits to subscribe to;
 - g) short particulars of any other alterations of capital, including calls;
 - h) financial results;
 - i) decision on voluntary delisting by the listed entity from stock exchange(s):

 5. Agreements (viz. shareholder agreement(s), joint venture agreement(s), family settlement agreement(s) (to the extent that it impacts management and control of the listed entity), agreement(s)/treaty(ies)/contract(s) with media companies) which are binding and not in normal course of business, revision(s) or amendment(s) and termination(s) thereof.

or control of the listed entity or impose any restriction or create any liability upon the listed entity, shall be disclosed to the Stock Exchanges, including disclosure of any rescission, amendment or alteration of such agreements thereto, whether or not the listed entity is a party to such agreements:

Provided that such agreements entered into by a listed entity in the normal course of business shall not be required to be disclosed unless they, either directly or indirectly or potentially or whose purpose and effect is to, impact the management or control of the listed entity or they are required to be disclosed in terms of any other provisions of these regulations.

Explanation: For the purpose of this clause, the term “directly or indirectly” includes agreements creating obligation on the parties to such agreements to ensure that listed entity shall or shall not act in a particular manner.]

6. ⁴¹¹[Fraud or defaults by a listed entity, its promoter, director, key managerial personnel, senior management or subsidiary or arrest of key managerial personnel, senior management, promoter or director of the listed entity, whether occurred within India or abroad:

For the purpose of this sub-paragraph:

- (i) ‘Fraud’ shall include fraud as defined under Regulation 2(1)(c) of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices relating to Securities Market) Regulations, 2003.
- (ii) ‘Default’ shall mean non-payment of the interest or principal amount in full on the date when the debt has become due and payable.

Explanation 1- In case of revolving facilities like cash credit, an entity would be considered to be in ‘default’ if the outstanding balance remains continuously in excess of the sanctioned limit or drawing power, whichever is lower, for more than thirty days.

Explanation 2- Default by a promoter, director, key managerial personnel, senior management, subsidiary shall mean default which has or may have an impact on the listed entity.]

7. Change in directors, key managerial personnel (Managing Director, Chief Executive Officer, Chief Financial Officer, Company Secretary etc.), ⁴¹²[senior management,] Auditor and Compliance Officer.

the date of resignation, the following disclosures shall be made to the stock exchanges by the listed entities:

i. ⁴¹⁵[The letter of resignation along with] detailed reasons for the resignation ⁴¹⁶[***] as given by the said director ⁴¹⁷[***].

⁴¹⁸[(ia). Names of listed entities in which the resigning director holds directorships, indicating the category of directorship and membership of board committees, if any.]

ii. The independent director shall, along with the detailed reasons, also provide a confirmation that there is no other material reasons other than those provided.

iii. The confirmation as provided by the independent director above shall also be disclosed by the listed entities to the stock exchanges along with the ⁴¹⁹[disclosures] as specified in sub-clause (i) ⁴²⁰[and (ii)] above.]

 14. Amendments to memorandum and articles of association of listed entity, in brief.

- (i) the presentation and the audio/video recordings shall be promptly made available on the website and in any case, before the next trading day or within twenty-four hours from the conclusion of such calls, whichever is earlier;
 - (ii) the transcripts of such calls shall be made available on the website within five working days of the conclusion of such calls:

The requirement for disclosure(s) of audio/video recordings and transcript shall be voluntary with effect from April 01, 2021 and mandatory with effect from April 01, 2022.;

- k) Approval of resolution plan by the Tribunal or rejection, if applicable;

 - (i) Pre and Post net-worth of the company;

- B. Events which shall be disclosed upon application of the guidelines for materiality referred sub-regulation (4) of regulation (30):**
1. Commencement or any postponement in the date of commencement of commercial production or commercial operations of any unit/division.
